MEMORANDUM FOR All personnel permanently assigned and/or attached to the United States Army Student Detachment (USASD)

**SUBJECT: Policy Memorandum #26 - Storage of Issued Table of Allowance 50 (TA-50) and Valuable Items in Privately Owned Vehicles (POVs)**

1. References:

- a. AR 190-51, Security of Unclassified Army Property (Sensitive and Nonsensitive)
- b. AR 710-2, Supply Policy Below the National Level
- c. AR 735-5, Policies and Procedures for Property Accountability
- d. AR 27-20, Claims

2. The purpose of this policy memorandum is to provide guidance for storage of issued individual TA-50 clothing/equipment and valuables in POVs.

3. Service members are judged by their discipline, and in part, by the manner in which they maintain their equipment and personal property as well as their personal conduct. They must project a proper military image that leaves no doubt that they live by a common set of military values and are guided through military order and discipline.

4. The command has a responsibility to do all that it can to ensure that service members live, work, and play in a safe and secure environment, and this applies to a service member's military and personal property. Service members have a personal responsibility to ensure that they do all that they can to help themselves by properly securing the government equipment that they are responsible/signed for and other valuable personal property.

5. Policy and Procedure:

a. Service members are prohibited from storing TA-50 and any government owned sensitive and/or pilferable items in plain view within their POVs. This includes, but is not limited to, any electronic equipment that is not permanently installed in their vehicle, tool boxes, cellular phones, computers, cameras, binoculars, hand-held two-way radios, or other pilferable items. Pilferable items are those items that have a resale value or

civilian application to personal possession and, therefore, are especially subject to theft. This paragraph of this policy is punitive. Violators may be subject to administrative or disciplinary action under the Uniform Code of Military Justice (UCMJ).

b. Service members will ensure that adequate and secure temporary storage when living off post and when/if they are required to leave TA-50 or other pilferable government items unattended in conjunction with inspection, mission, training, or other requirements.

c. Service members are advised to secure any personally owned high-value items and to avoid leaving them in plain view within their POVs. This includes, but is not limited to, stereo and other electronic equipment that is not permanently installed in their vehicle, wallets or purses, tool boxes, cellular phones, laptops, electronics readers, check books, and debit/credit cards. Failure to properly store or secure items in vehicles may result in noncompensable claims.
